

## **Driving Directions to Camp Cody**

It is not suggested to make this drive at night, especially if unfamiliar with the route.

Head east from Portland on I-84 to the Wood Village exit, (approx 10 miles from downtown) (Note all signs to US 26 & Mt Hood)

Take Wood Village exit, following all signs to US 26 and Mt Hood .

Travel about 4 miles along the main road (Holman) crossing major east west thoroughfares Holgate, Glisan & Stark. Go left on Burnside.

Once heading east on US 26, proceed for approx 45 miles to Government Camp.

Continue east past Government Camp following all signs to Hood River and US 35. (Do not take Bend turn off)

Proceed on US 35 for approx 5 miles to the White River Canyon. (This is not well marked, but it is a big open river canyon with a few parking areas and large open area.) Look carefully for Road 48. Turn right onto Road 48 and proceed for 24 miles. Watch for deer on road.

After about 23 miles pay close attention...

Continue on Road 48 down a hill and up a hill as Road 48 curves to the right (east). A sign near the end of the curve indicates a road junction coming on the left. Slow down, and look for the obscure junction. Turn left. You are now on Road 4810. Go right at the first junction on Road 4810. You will pass a green water tank on your left and then the Rock Creek Guard Station. (Note: the Guard Station is not much, a portable, trailer type structure.) The Camp Cody entrance is on the left about a hundred yards beyond the Guard Station. Look for the buck and pole fencing.

Camp Cody is right next to Rock Creek Reservoir, in case you end up there, wondering if you are close.

If you get to the tiny town of Wamic, you have gone about 4 miles too far, but you might find someone to ask for directions.
