SCHOOL DAY

8:10 a.m. to 3:10 p.m.

HOMEROOM

21 students to 1 teacher + 1 TA/intern. 215 students total in grades 1-5.

TEACHERS AND SPECIALISTS

Homeroom teachers instruct in math, literacy, and social studies; specialist teachers for modern language (Mandarin or Spanish), science, music, art, PE and wellness, woodshop, technology and digital citizenship, and library skills; full-time counselor; equity and inclusion staff.

CONFERENCES AND COMMUNICATIONS

Three parent-teacher conferences annually, one student-led and written reports. Weekly newsletters from homeroom and BLS.

COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

Alternating weeks of community meetings or small, mixed-grade advisory groups (C&Cs).

LEARNING SPACES

Two large homerooms for each grade level, with distinct learning areas; dedicated art studio, woodshop, music and language classrooms, science lab, library, dynamic playground.

LUNCH/SNACKS

Daily choice of school lunch or bring your own.

RECESS AND FIELD TRIPS

Daily outdoor recess; day trips throughout the year and an annual class trip, which can include an overnight stay.

TECHNOLOGY

One assigned iPad for each student; Tinkering with Technology class.

TRADITIONS

Disco Friday, Harvest Festival, Spring Festival, Community Meetings, and Learning Celebrations.

TRANSPORTATION

Catlin Gabel a.m. / p.m. bus routes, carpool system, and TriMet.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Typically runs from 7:15-8:10 a.m. (included in tuition) and 3:00-6:00 p.m. (additional cost).
